The Board of Clark County Commissioners met in regular session pursuant to adjournment in accordance with Section 121.22 O.R.C. (Sunshine Law) at the Fairgrounds, Arts and Crafts Building, 4401 South Charleston Pike, Springfield, Ohio.

Call to Order, Commissioner Lohnes

Resolution 2014-0556

Following the pledge and invocation, Commissioner Lohnes recognized the county officials and employees in attendance.

Swearing In Ceremony:

Sheriff Kelly thanked the Commissioners for holding the meeting and he introduced his staff. The longest serving elected official was Ronny Vincent, Clerk of Courts, who administered the oath. The Sheriff shared a little bit of background information about each deputy. The Swearing In ceremony was held.

Maureen Fagans, United Senior Services, requested the levy renewal be placed on the ballot this November. Seniors have enjoyed the benefits of the levy since 1990. They requested a renewal. It was currently a 1 mill levy that was put into place in 2006. Elderly United has been in business for 46 years. It was organized by Betty Pitzer. See attached summary sheet of the services and benefits of the levy. Commissioner Lohnes asked how long the renewal period was for. Ms. Fagans said five years.

Commissioner Lohnes mentioned the Golden Wedding Celebration that was organized by Elderly United.

Commissioner Hartley moved to approve the minutes of the last meeting and dispense with reading of the same. Commissioner Detrick seconded the motion. The roll being called for passage resulted as follows:

Agenda Review:

Commissioner Hartley asked about the following resolutions:

Resolution 2014-0558 authorized a contract with the City of Springfield for the local government fund distribution. This maintained the existing formula. If they do not get concurrence between the City and the County the statutory formula must be used. The statutory formula needs data from the 1920s and 1930s which is difficult to find. Therefore, he recommended the alternate formula.

Commissioner Hartley requested a separate vote on Resolution 2014-0566 and 0567.

Commissioner Detrick thanked everyone for coming out to the meeting.

County Engineer, John Burr reviewed resolutions 2014-0559 through 0561.

Resolution 2014-0559 authorized a couple right of ways for the Lower Valley Pike project.

Resolution 2014-0560 authorized intergovernmental agreements for pavement marking. They bundle the townships into one to decrease the unit cost.

Resolution 2014-0561 authorized the contract for the paving partnership with the Village of Enon.

Engineer Burr gave a project update: Upper Valley Pike was complete. County Line/Upper Valley Pike will start August 12th. The project was to correct safety issues. Spangler will start August 4th and complete October 17. One lane of traffic will be maintained for that project. The Hampton Bridge was complete. The bridge on Folk Ream was under construction. County paving was in process. Chip seal would begin next week.

Commissioner Detrick commented resolution 2014-0562 appointed members to the LEPC.

Resolution 2014-0563: Mr. Kennedy explained no bids were received however half a dozen were requested.

Resolution 2014-0564 dealt with upgrades at the Southwest Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant. Clark County served 11,000 customers each on water and sewers. That included the I-70 industrial park. They were meeting EPA standards. The project was 79% complete.

Commissioner Lohnes had not questions.

Commissioner Hartley moved to approve the agenda in its entirety with the exception of Resolutions 2014-0566 and 0567. Commissioner Detrick seconded the motion. The roll being called for passage resulted as follows:

Commissioner Detrick moved to approve Resolution 2014-0566 and 0567. Commissioner Lohnes seconded the motion. The roll being called for passage resulted as follows:

Before Commissioner Hartley cast his vote made a statement. Resolution 2014-0567 was a disservice to the taxpayers of Clark County. It was not legal. It was an attempt to disregard sections 307.09 and 307.10 of the Ohio Revised Code. Even the attorney(s) from Konecranes acknowledges this problem by inserting 4a and b in the agreement of lease. This problem could have been overcome if the CIC had purchased the facility and sold it to Konecranes as suggested at that time. Commissioner Hartley supported that. Although he would have voted no, the Commission could have sold the building and walked away. Instead staff has wasted 400-500 hours on this transaction. There will be more hours wasted on this if a tax payer lawsuit was filed. The sale price ignored the appraised value. The County Auditor's appraised value of the building was \$1,037,370. The only certified commercial appraised value was \$900,000. Clark County paid \$1,500 for that appraisal. The County selling the property for a substantially below amount was a disgrace to the taxpayers. If the County was going to provide a facility to a multimillion dollar foreign corporation for a cost well below the value of the building, should the County then provide buildings at a discount to other businesses and business entities? Commissioner Hartley also questioned the \$200,000 indemnification for Konecranes in section 27, E,

iii of the agreement. This whole process doesn't pass the smell test. The sale was engineered by the director of the Chamber of Commerce and CIC. Conflicts of interest are evident in this transaction. He questioned if the Commission should terminate the lease at this time. If a tax payer lawsuit gets filed there is the possibility of an injunction blocking the sale of this property. If Resolution 2014-0566 passes there may be no sale and no lease.

Before casting his vote, Commissioner Detrick made a statement. He stated they were under the advice of their legal counsel. There were appraisals on this building for \$700,000, \$750,000, \$900,000 and the Auditor's appraisal of \$1 million. The agreement was reached at \$800,000. Konecranes promised 20 jobs. They have brought 100 jobs and retained 300. These were livable wage jobs not minimum wage jobs. This was equal to General Electric getting millions of dollars in subsidies to build a headquarters in downtown Cincinnati. There was no comparison. Konecrane was not getting any tax abatements. They will be paying real estate taxes to the local entities to the tune of \$25-30,000. Konecrane had already expended \$200,000 in upgrading the facility. In regard to foreign investment, one third of the money in the United States comes from foreign money. What are we going to do, build a wall around the United States? He hoped not. There needs to be foreign influence. There were people lined up at the borders to come here because of the enterprises. It was ludicrous to not welcome them with open arms in America.

An unidentified woman in the audience worked at Konecranes and knew of a person that had worked for them for four years as a temp but had not been brought on permanently and had no benefits. She wondered if this was common practice. Commissioner Detrick was not aware of that but noted the opportunity given to that person to work because Konecranes was here.

Martin (inaudible last name), wanted the Board to quit messing around with Konecranes. This was a chance to sell Springfield and Clark County. He said the Board needed to get in with them and get the issue settled.

Commissioner Lohnes clarified the sale amount of the building was \$787,000. It used to be the Ag Building.
