Sentencing in Double Aggravated Vehicular Homicide: Defendant, Lewis Chambers, was sentenced on February 9, 2016 to twelve (12) years and six (6) months following his plea of guilty in 15-CR-0136 to two counts of aggravated vehicular homicide, for causing the deaths of 12-year-old Sophia Gruber and her grandfather, 65-year-old Richard Gruber. Chambers was nearly three times the legal limit at the time of the crash. Chambers is to begin serving his sentence immediately.

Guilty Plea in Attempted Murder of Police Officer: Defendant, Haunz Bray, pleaded guilty to Aggravated Burglary and Attempted Murder with a gun specification. Bray acted with his codefendant, Darius Hull, a juvenile bound over from Clark County Juvenile Court. On the evening of October 2, 2015 Defendants were exiting a residence after committing an aggravated burglary when Springfield Police Officers confronted them. Bray fired shots at officers. Hull pleaded guilty earlier this month to aggravated burglary with a gun specification, and was sentenced to eleven (11) years in prison. Bray's disposition is set for early March, at which time he could face a maximum sentence of twenty-five (25) years in prison.

Sexting Diversion Program Rolled Out to Area Schools: Materials were delivered to Clark County Schools earlier this month to help educate and instruct students, parents, and educational professionals about the potential implications of a student sending a sexually explicit photo or video. Under Ohio law, a person can be charged with possession or distribution of child pornography for taking, sending, or possessing any sexually explicit photo of or involving a minor. This includes a minor taking a nude or sexually explicit photo of themselves and sending it to a boyfriend or girlfriend. The Clark County Prosecutor's Office, in conjunction with the Clark County Juvenile Court has implemented the STOP Program, which will run eligible first-time offenders through the juvenile diversion program in lieu of the potential felony conviction they face. If the program is completed successfully, all criminal charges will be dismissed.
