June 1, 2016: Guilty Plea in Robbery Case

On June 1, 2016, Ricky Hand entered a plea of guilty to Breaking and Entering, a felony of the fifth degree, Aggravated Robbery, a felony of the first degree, and five counts of Robbery, a felony of the second degree. The charges stemmed from the robbery of Burger King, Long John Silvers, a nail salon, bars and other businesses in the area. There was also a charge stemming from the armed robbery of Nifty Fifties bar on March 16. Judge O'Neill will sentence Hand on June 22, 2016 where Mr. Hand faces a maximum possible sentence of 52 years in prison.

May 4, 2016: Release of Together Against Violence Video

On May 4, 2016 the Together Against Violence Video was released on YouTube. Kisha Cole and George Miller discussed their personal stories and the devastating effects of violence on the individual and the Clark County Community. George Miller was convicted of murder and served 35 years. He explains the profound impact that one choice had on his entire life and permanently affected a family. Cole and Miller urge others to consider the consequences and make the right choice – the choice against violence. The Clark County Prosecutor's Office is constantly striving to reduce violence in our community and hopes that this video will help us in meet that goal.
