

The Board of Clark County Commissioners met in regular session pursuant to adjournment in accordance with Section 121.22 O.R.C. (Sunshine Law) in the Commission Chambers, 3130 East Main Street, Springfield, Ohio.

The following members and guests were present: Commissioner Melanie F. Wilt; Commissioner Lowell McGlothin; Commissioner Richard L. Lohnes; Jenny Hutchinson, County Administrator; Michelle Noble, Assistant County Administrator/HR Director; Megan Burr, Commission Clerk; Beau Thompson, Assistant County Prosecutor; Melissa Tuttle, Clerk of Courts.

Commissioner Wilt called the meeting to order and introductions were made.

*Agenda Review:*

Commissioner Lohnes asked about the following resolutions:

Resolution 2021-0107 authorized the contract with Benefactor Group for the fairgrounds strategic plan. Commissioner Lohnes asked who would be involved. Commissioner Wilt said one Commissioner, a member(s) from the Agriculture Society and a member(s) from OEAA. That group will start meeting soon.

Resolution 2021-0113 appointed Lauren Ross to fulfill the term of Jim Brown.

Commissioner McGlothin asked about the following resolutions:

Resolution 2021-0106 authorized the contract with Wagner Paving for the black top at the Dog Shelter. The cost is much less than expected. He was glad to see it. They will repave the entire lot.

*Commissioner Updates:*

Commissioner Wilt had a call with 7Eleven that went well. There was no immediate plan to merge the brands. They are dependent on the workforce in this area. They acquired 4,000 stores.

Commissioner Lohnes wondered if Major Clark would attend to give an update on the 911 Center opening.

Ms. Clements-Pitstick wanted guidance on how to impact the homeless issues.

Discussion ensued about updates to the benefits. Ms. Noble is working hard on finding creative options.

Commissioner Lohnes said COVID deaths through February were 330. Only 27 deaths were under the age of 60.

Commissioner Lohnes attended the Board of Elections meeting yesterday. There were many Commission items mentioned. Mr. Harkins suggested their legal representation talk to the Board's about finalizing the separation of IS related items. Clarity is needed on what belongs to whom. They have \$50,000 in their budget for cyber security. Mr. Thompson and Mr. Pickering have discussed it and have been working through those issues.

Vaccines are being pushed out by the feds to other providers that are not being tracked by the Health District or EMA.

The \$1.9 trillion relief bill includes \$350 billion going to state and local governments. They are using a formula that incorporates unemployment rates of the state instead of basing it on population. It would be based on the fourth quarter unemployment rates. Ohio was at 5.5%. If they continue with that formula, Ohio will miss out on \$800 million.

Discussion ensued about fraudulent unemployment claims.

Commissioner Lohnes shared updates from a webinar he attended about the state budget. The state general revenue fund is expected to grow by 2%. The sales tax estimate for 2021-2022 is an increase of 5.1%. The estimate for the following year is an increase of 3.2%. Indignant defense is the number one priority for CCAO. \$90 million is in the budget for broadband.

*Clerk of Courts AB Graham Move:*

Ms. Tuttle followed up on the move to AB Graham. Mr. Graver has worked really hard to get a cradle point in place and the technology needs set up. It will be temporary until the state can tap into the fiber. The plan is to move everyone to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of AB Graham. There is one item she wanted to discuss. She had an issue with the title staff being moved to the second floor. She preferred the lower level.

Commissioner Wilt noted concerns about having staff in the space when it needs additional work to get it set up well for her. Ms. Hutchinson said the plan was for three windows to be cut in the drywall for counters. Commissioner Wilt felt it made more sense for everyone to be moved to the second floor until the lower level was ready. Ms. Tuttle was concerned she wouldn't get both spaces if she didn't move into them now.

Ms. Hutchinson asked if additional security was needed due to the volume of customers Ms. Tuttle would be bringing in for titles. Per her email, last month 400 titles were processed.

Ms. Tuttle corrected the total to 671 last month. Many of those were for dealers. Ms. Tuttle wanted to wait and see if an additional deputy was needed.

Ms. Hutchinson explained the issue of who will fund the additional deputy is back on the table if the customers increase that much. The title office was never in the plans for AB Graham which increases the foot traffic. Last week it was decided the title office would move to Southern Village and now Ms. Tuttle is requesting a change.

Ms. Tuttle stated she was fine with her staff working in the space as it is renovated.

Commissioner Wilt said the long term use of the lower level needs decided by the Board. She asked if the Board was willing to allow the Clerk of Courts to be in both spaces. Commissioner Lohnes talked to all three elected officials and they were fine with it. Commissioner Wilt emailed Mr. Burr who was ok with it as long as he could get records imaged and he had access to shared conference space. She felt there should still be shared conference space on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. Commissioner Wilt was ok with the Clerk of Courts moving to the lower level long term. Temporarily, they should be moved to the second floor until renovations are complete.

Commissioner McGlothlin asked what type of counter space she wanted. Ms. Tuttle wanted it to match the other departments.

Ms. Noble asked how Ms. Tuttle would protect employees from dust and noise. Ms. Tuttle replied a plastic curtain. Ms. Noble expressed concern for a workers comp issue and the reality of working in that space during renovation.

Ms. Hutchinson respected Ms. Tuttle's requests however; ignoring unnecessary risks was not wise. She didn't think Buildings and Grounds staff could have the space renovated in two days. She did not want to put employees at unnecessary risks. There are three employees going in that space.

Ms. Tuttle was upset Ms. Hutchinson was bringing up more issues.

Ms. Hutchinson gently reminded the Board she is doing her job by bringing up key points to think about but she doesn't feel she is being heard.

Commissioner Wilt did not want to rush and noted both spaces need modified. Ms. Tuttle stated she had no current requests for modification to the second floor space. Ms. Hutchinson explained there would be modifications based on drops that need installed. The Board needs to do what is best for the county. She felt there would be a security issue.

Commissioner Wilt noted Ms. Tuttle was willing to put money into the Municipal Building to stay longer. She asked MS. Tuttle if she would use that money to pay for the additional deputy. Ms. Tuttle committed to paying for the additional costs of a deputy.

Ms. Tuttle heard Ms. Noble and Ms. Hutchinson's concerns. She doesn't want everyone to feel rushed but that's how she feels having to get out of the space in the Municipal Building. Her biggest thing is she has what is needed for her staff.

Commissioners McGlothlin and Wilt stated the Board granted her the lower level. Commissioner Wilt wanted it done right. She wanted her team to do it right and didn't think it could be done in three days. It can be set up right by putting everyone on the second floor temporarily. She restated all of Ms. Tuttle's staff needs to go to the second floor. She felt that was the right thing to do.

Ms. Tuttle said that over the past month when meeting about this with Mr. Swank and Ms. Hutchinson they said it would take 2-3 says to get the space ready. Now it is longer. Ms. Hutchinson replied that was for the second floor space. That wasn't for the lower level.

Ms. Tuttle said the computers are all set up by the state. The only IT needs are phones and credit cards. She didn't know she would pay for the cradle point. Ms. Hutchinson said confirmed she would pay for the cradle point the general fund is not required to support the title office.

Commissioner Lohnes said the title work in Municipal Court will be disrupted and moving once is ideal. However, he preferred not moving in the lower level space until it is ready.

Ms. Tuttle was upset new points were brought up today. She is being rushed out of the building. This time of year is not good for her.

Commissioner Lohnes restated the lower level needed to be complete before title staff moved in. To accommodate, she can move staff to Southern Village and adjust office hours if needed.

Ms. Hutchinson noted Ms. Tuttle repeatedly was concerned about the stress level of her staff moving, yet she is willing to have them work in a construction zone. It is a safety concern for the staff and the public during construction.

Commissioner Lohnes did not want operations during construction. He supported the increased security need. It would cost approximately \$100,000. He noted Sheriff Burchett hoped it would be considered because she was not aware the volume of traffic would increase. Commissioner Lohnes stated the space needed to be complete before staff moved in. She had alternative options to get her through the construction period.

Commissioner Wilt asked how long for the construction phase. Ms. Hutchinson replied around a month. They need to develop the layout and go from there. Jacks and drops will need installed. That conversation will happen later.

Ms. Tuttle said she is for the path of least resistance. She has asked for proposed plans from Mr. Swank and she hasn't received them. She appreciated the concerns of the Board. Since she is paying for the cradle point she guessed she is paying for the construction costs. Ms. Hutchinson explained Mr. Swank couldn't design a space without knowing which space she would go into.

Commissioner Lohnes again said the space would be done right. He asked where she wanted the cradle point installed or if she wanted to move title to Southern Village. The Sheriff is concerned about the increased foot traffic.

Commissioner Wilt committed to getting one space ready and promised to get the second space ready for her but it will not be ready by March 8<sup>th</sup>. She agreed with Commissioner Lohnes. Commissioner Wilt asked her where she wanted to temporarily divert title customers.

Ms. Tuttle again requested the lower level space be complete. The second floor can wait because she can absorb those functions in the legal office.

Commissioner Lohnes said if the focus is totally on the lower level that area will not be usable and all title activities need to happen at Southern Village.

Ms. Hutchinson reminded the Board of the cradle point issue. There is concern about the strength of the signal in the basement. Some of that work may still go to Southern Village. That can't be corrected until the state installs it. The Board will no longer be giving the state access to the county fiber. The cradle point will act like a hot spot on a cell phone.

Commissioner McGlothlin told Ms. Tuttle she got her way on the two spaces. Titles can be processed at Southern Village.

Commissioner Lohnes said staff will do their best on the lower level space but in the interim she can use Southern Village.

Ms. Tuttle said every time she discusses this there is another issue and new information presented.

Commissioner Wilt expressed frustration and again told Ms. Tuttle the Board is trying to do the right thing for the county and along the way new information comes up and one has to pivot. Everyone has to do that. The end goal is still the same so what difference does it make how it is done.

Ms. Tuttle said it mattered because of the timeline. Ms. Hutchinson said the state connecting to the county fiber was a temporary solution not a permanent fix. The temporary solution now is the cradle point. Let's do it right so it is done and completed.

Ms. Tuttle asked about the landscaping costs. Commissioner Wilt said that is a separate conversation. Ms. Tuttle said the state would give a key to Mr. Graver if they used the county conduit. Ms. Hutchinson said that wasn't the issue. The lines need to be available for county growth. Commissioner Wilt explained the county has major network upgrades that have to run through the fiber. There is no responsibility in the ORC to provide that for the title office.

Ms. Hutchinson recapped the state equipment will move to the lower level, however, it will not be operational until the construction is done. Staff will continue to focus on the second floor. In the meantime, the state needs to get in and start their fiber.

Commissioner Lohnes noted depending on how fast the remodel goes will determine if title work is diverted to Southern Village.

Ms. Tuttle would appreciate expediency from the Commission to get this done. If it is necessary, she suggested outsourcing the construction. She was concerned about the skill level of Buildings and Grounds staff.

Commissioner Lohnes quickly responded it will take more time to hire someone and Buildings and Grounds staff was very skilled to do this work. He noted they remodeled Judge Carey's office space and the Commission Chambers. It is a priority to get title out of Municipal Court. The security issue will be looked at.

Ms. Tuttle was comfortable with no security if the deputy had to leave her post to handle an issue in the courts.

The Board thanked Ms. Tuttle.

Ms. Tuttle didn't want to leave until she had assurance she would get both spaces in AB Graham.

Commissioner Wilt replied she would get both spaces and it is on the record several times.

*County Administrator Updates:*

Ms. Hutchinson said the 911 Center dedication resolution is ready. It will be on the agenda closer to when 911 staff will move into the building. Discussion ensued.

Ms. Noble spoke about incentive options for employees to get the COVID vaccine. She looked at what other companies were doing. Most were giving an additional four hours of time off and a cash incentive. Incentives varied from \$25 to \$100. Ms. Hutchinson thought it would be nice to get gift cards to local businesses to help encourage local spending. Employees can choose two \$25 gift cards. Employees can choose which vaccine they receive. Commissioner Wilt asked about those not eligible for the vaccine. Ms. Noble said they have to allow those not eligible to participate in an alternative way. The Board asked about flu shots. Ms. Noble said they are offered on site. Wellness points are offered for all vaccines. Commissioner Lohnes asked if they get extra wellness points for the COVID vaccine. Ms. Hutchinson suggested doubling those points for the COVID vaccine because of the pandemic. The Commissioners agreed.

Mr. Cooper said the annual report is in the works. The strategic plan is being finalized as well.

Commissioner Lohnes suggested asking the elected officials to have a strategic plan ready to share during the next budget cycle.
