

The Board of Clark County Commissioners met in regular session pursuant to adjournment in accordance with Section 121.22 O.R.C. (Sunshine Law) at the Commission Office, 50 East Columbia Street, Springfield, Ohio.

The following members and guests were present: Commissioner Melanie Flax Wilt; Commissioner Richard L. Lohnes; Commissioner Lowell McGlothlin; Michelle Noble, Assistant County Administrator/HR Director; Megan Burr, Clerk; Tony Bailey, Key Vision; Beau Thompson, Assistant County Prosecutor; Bob Snavely & Kirk Mizerek, Palmer Energy; Virginia Martycz & Erin Willoughby, Job and Family Services; Michael Cooper, Public Information Officer; Wendy Holt, Clark County Sheriff's Office; Tony Bailey, Key Vision.

Commissioner Wilt called the meeting to order and introductions were made.

Electric Aggregation:

Resolution 2019-0700: Commissioner Wilt explained this was the resolution to authorize electric aggregation program to be placed on the ballot during the primary next year. Mr. Mizerek said the ballot language needed clarification as to what townships could vote on it. There are a handful of townships in Clark County that have aggregation already in place. It could be confusing to those that already have it. They wanted to make sure the Board of Elections put the ballot language on in the right townships.

Mr. Thompson has already worked on it. The Board of Elections has left the interpretation up to him so he will make that determination and send it in a memo.

Mr. Snavely will hold public meetings, attend township meetings, and help with social media campaigns. That work will begin in January/February. He asked about gas aggregation. Mrs. Burr explained the Board directed staff to work on electric aggregation however if the Board chose to proceed with gas aggregation a resolution would be prepared. Commissioner Wilt didn't think it affected as many residents. She asked for it to be a listed topic to discuss at next week's meeting.

Commissioner Wilt asked about marketing. Mr. Mizerek said the cost of printing and postage will be covered by them if it isn't a high price. For example, they will take care of printing information to add to water bills. Commissioner Wilt asked for a FAQ page for the county website. Mr. Snavely agreed education was the most important piece.

Ms. Martycz noted a minor correction on a transfer for Resolution 2019-0707. The account the money should be transferred to is PCSA/DJFS not Common Pleas. Mrs. Burr will correct it before the official vote.

Ms. Martycz introduced the new deputy director for Ohio Means Jobs. Ms. Willoughby comes from OOD and has a talent for working with individuals that are the hardest to serve. She shared some of her background.

Commissioner McGlothlin asked if she would work with OIC. Ms. Martycz said she has tried to make contact several times but no attempts have been returned. The issue is OIC wants money from DJFS without following the RFP process and they cannot allow that. She also noted she cannot spend JFS money on those incarcerated. Once they are out of jail she can help.

Commissioner Wilt welcomed Ms. Willoughby. Ms. Willoughby was excited.

Commissioner Wilt thanked Ms. Martycz for the information prepared for her for the Face the State Panel on Friday. It went really well.

Agenda Review:

Commissioner Lohnes had no questions.

Commissioner McGlothlin had no questions.

Discussion ensued about calendar events.

Jail Chaplaincy/Key Vision Update:

Commissioner Wilt invited Tony Bailey to attend to share more information about workforce training in the jail. He has done a great job pulling that together. Commissioner McGlothlin asked if he works with OIC. Mr. Bailey replied sort of.

Mr. Bailey said 60-80% of those incarcerated receive no treatment for drug and alcohol addictions. His goal is to stop the crime, stop the addiction and build the workforce. Jail time was a great opportunity. The problem is individuals may come from a toxic lifestyle. Then be put in jail which is another toxic environment and then get released. Jail is a great opportunity, if taken, because the individual is sober. He shared a video. He is also presented the attached request for funding. The funding would be spent on videos, brochures and information sharing. In 2018, there were 157 graduates of the month-long program with zero cost. That program continues. This funding would be for the clinical piece to have a clinical team available in the jail to help with addiction issues. This could be a great tool for probation and parole. Commissioner Wilt asked if he could track the rate of success of individuals upon release. Mr. Bailey replied it was difficult but he would definitely look into it. He planned to rope in Job and Family Services, Clark State Community College and the Chamber of Commerce. Commissioner Wilt stressed the Board would need to see the return for any dollar invested. Commissioner McGlothlin agreed, and wanted more information about how successful the program was. Commissioner Wilt suggested tracking if they continue to hold jobs, do they get in trouble with the law, etc. Commissioner Wilt further explained the County's budget process. He will need to submit his request on the appropriate form to the County Administrator. Ms. Noble will send him the necessary information. Discussion ensued.

Commissioner Lohnes was open to the plan and understood some of it was in creation mode. He asked if the funding request was an annual request or a one-time request. Mr. Bailey said the request was for a one time investment, however, there would be an annual cost of about \$18,000 to continue the video portion of it. Commissioner Lohnes asked where the remainder of the funding was coming from. Mr. Bailey replied grants and donations. Commissioner McGlothlin asked for clarification on the total funding being requested. Mr. Bailey requested \$48,600 as a total one time cost, then the yearly cost would be around \$18,000. Commissioner McGlothlin asked if other entities were being asked for money. Mr. Bailey replied yes. Commissioner McGlothlin clarified Mr. Bailey would be happy with any amount the Board chose to grant. Mr. Bailey replied yes.

The Board thanked him.

Sheriff's Office Grant Program:

Wendy Holt, Clark County Sheriff's Office, shared the grant proposal. See attached. Delaware County is doing something very similar. The Sheriff's Office will give up to \$20,000 to the community, specifically to private non-profit organizations. They will have to have a focus that meets one of the three criteria. The grantees have to focus on specific areas. There would be a three-member review committee that they would like the County Administrator to sit on. The other two members would be Ms. Holt and the Sheriff. Mr. Cooper asked when he could push out information. Ms. Holt said it is still being reviewed by the Prosecutor. Once everything is finalized she will share it with him to push out.

Commissioner Wilt said the kick off meeting for new website was held.

The Board recessed until 10:00 a.m.

**Authorize All Action Necessary to Effect a Governmental Electricity
Aggregation Program with Opt-Out Provisions Pursuant to Section 4928.20 of the Ohio Revised Code
and Directing the Clark County Board of Elections to Submit a Ballot Question to the Electors**

Commissioner Lohnes moved to approve the following:

Whereas, the Ohio Legislature has enacted electric deregulation legislation which authorizes the legislative authorities of municipal corporations, townships and counties to aggregate the retail electrical loads located in the respective jurisdictions and to enter into service agreements to facilitate for those loads the purchase and sale of electricity; and,

Whereas, such legislative authorities may exercise such authority jointly with any other legislative authorities; and,

Whereas, governmental aggregation provides an opportunity for residential and small business customers collectively to participate in the potential benefits of electricity deregulation through lower electric rates which they would not otherwise be able to have individually; and,

Whereas, this Board seeks to establish a governmental aggregation program with opt-out provisions pursuant to Section 4928.20, Ohio Revised Code (the "Aggregation Program"), for the residents, businesses and other electric consumers in the unincorporated areas of Clark County and in conjunction with any other municipal corporation, township, county or other political subdivision of the State of Ohio, as permitted by law.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Ohio, that:

Section 1: This Board finds and determines that it is in the best interest of Clark County, its residents, businesses and other electric consumers located within the unincorporated areas of the County to establish the Aggregation Program in Clark County. Provided that this Resolution and the Aggregation Program is approved by the electors of the unincorporated areas of the County pursuant to Section 2 of this Resolution, the County is hereby authorized to aggregate in accordance with Section 4928.20, Ohio Revised Code, the retail electrical loads located within the unincorporated areas of the County and, for that purpose, to enter into service agreements to facilitate for those loads the sale and purchase of electricity. The County may exercise such authority jointly with any other municipal corporation, township or county or other political subdivision of the State of Ohio to the full extent permitted by law. The aggregation will occur automatically for each person owning, occupying, controlling, or using an electric load center proposed to be aggregated and will provide for the opt-out rights described in Section 3 of this Resolution.

Section 2: The Board of Elections of Clark County is hereby directed to submit the following question to the electors of the unincorporated areas of the County at the primary election on March 17, 2020;

"Shall Clark County have the authority to aggregate the retail electric loads located in the unincorporated areas of the County, and for that purpose, enter into service agreements to facilitate for those loads the sale and purchase of electricity, such aggregation to occur automatically except where any person elects to opt-out?"

The Clerk of this Board is instructed immediately to file a certified copy of this Resolution and the proposed form of the ballot question with the Clark County Board of Elections not less than seventy-five (75) days prior to March 17, 2020. The Aggregation Program shall not take effect unless approved by a majority of the electors voting upon this Resolution and the Aggregation Program provided for herein at the election held pursuant to this Section 2 and Section 4928.20, Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: Upon the approval of a majority of the electors voting at the election provided for in Section 2 of this resolution, this Board individually or jointly with any other political subdivision, shall develop a plan of operation and governance for the Aggregation Program. Before adopting such plan, this Board shall hold at least two public hearings on the plan. Before the first hearing, notice of the hearings shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the County. The notice shall summarize the plan and state the date, time, and location of each hearing. No plan adopted by this Board shall aggregate the electrical load of any electric load center within the unincorporated areas of the County unless the plan in advance clearly discloses to the person owning, occupying, controlling, or using the load center that the person will be enrolled automatically in the Aggregation Program and will remain so enrolled unless the person affirmatively elects by a stated procedure not to be so enrolled. The disclosure shall state prominently the rates, charges, and other terms and conditions of enrollment. The stated procedure shall allow any person enrolled in

the Aggregation Program the opportunity to opt-out of the program every three years without paying a switching fee. Any such person who opts out of the Aggregation Program pursuant to the stated procedure shall default to the standard service offer provided under Section 4928.141, Section 4928.142, Section 4928.143, or division (D) of Section 4928.35 (or any other applicable statute), Ohio Revised Code, until the person chooses an alternative supplier.

Section 4: This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 5: This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its adoption.
