

I. Call to Order: 8:33 AM

- A. 8:33 AM, 26 members present
- B. Brooke Wagner welcomed attending members

II. Old Business

- A. Coalition Engagement Agreement
 - 1. Thanked those who have submitted CEAs. Requested organizations that have not signed to complete and submit the CEA.
- B. TTT Grant Update
 - 1. The TTT Trauma Informed Care for Justice Impacted Citizens grant was awarded to Clark County by SAMSHA and approved by BOCC. This grant will allow 10 people from Clark County to become Trained Trainers in TIC4JIC. This is 10 less people than we originally requested. SAMSHA decreased the number of trainers from each community from 20 to 10 in order to accommodate more communities.

III. New Business

- A. Fair Chance Day
 - 1. Discussed Fair Chance Day and when & how often it should occur. Our plan is to have Fair Chance Day monthly on either a Wednesday or Thursday. The location of the event is dependent on which day we wish to hold the event. Coalition members were asked to fill out which day works best for them to attend the Fair Chance Day.
 - 2. It was decided to have the first Fair Chance Day in April, Reentry Month
- B. Reentry Month Planning Committee
 - 1. April is Reentry Month: We are going to plan capacity building and outreach to justice-involved citizens.
 - 2. We are looking for individuals interested in helping with Reentry Month to join the Planning Committee by reaching out to Brooke Wagner.
 - 3. A survey was given to coalition members regarding possible events for Reentry Month, including Fair Chance Day, a Certificate for Qualified Employment (CQE) information session, TTT Grant training, a wallet drive, a justice-impacted speaker, and narcan training
 - 4. Coalition member Mario Yarbrow proposed having an event similar to “Family Matters” in Dayton. This is a very popular workshop event for returning citizens, service providers, and community members. This workshop event included speakers, classes, and seminars.
 - 5. Those with any suggestions for events or who wish to participate and/or help plan the events are welcome to join the Planning Committee by reaching out to Brooke Wagner and/or signing up on the survey.
- C. Service Inventory Survey
 - 1. The coalition can share a spreadsheet with all data from the Service Inventory Survey once all data is entered. We discussed the possibility of formatting and sharing it with the community and other service providers.

2. Data collection for the Service Inventory Survey is to begin March 1st, 2023.

D. Upcoming Grants

1. Reviewed a list of current grants available which members and their organizations have the ability to apply for.
2. There is a spreadsheet with all current grants that are available and accepting submissions as of last week, however, new grants are being released each day.

E. Partner Highlight

1. A special thanks was given to Ohio Jobs and Family Services, who donate the space for our Reentry Coalition meetings.
2. A special thanks was given to Clark County Public Library, who donate space for the free Legal Clinic hosted by the Reentry Department.

F. For the Good of the Order

1. Next legal clinic is Saturday, February 25th, 11am-2pm at the Clark County Public Library
2. The Reentry Department is hiring 2 Reentry Specialists, Ohio Means Jobs and the VA are both currently hiring
3. There is a job fair March 29th open to everyone at the Hollenbeck Bayley Creative Arts and Conference Center. There are 60 employers looking to hire.
4. On March 15th, Citilookout is hosting a viewing of a documentary on the opioid epidemic.
5. Homeless court update: Dayton is working on creating a homeless court, which would be the first in Ohio. There is a judge in Clark County who is interested in implementing a homeless court in Springfield. Information and updates on homeless court will be shared with the coalition as they occur.

G. Themed Grants

1. The Coalition broke into groups based on their area of service, such as mental health, healthcare, housing, and corrections to look over a packet of grants pertaining to their area. They then discussed possible grants which apply to providers in the Coalition.
