

Reentry Meeting 1/17/23 Minutes

- I. Call to Order: 8:36 AM**
 - A. 8:35 AM, 21 members present
 - B. Brooke Wagner welcomed attending members
- II. Approval of minutes**
 - A. Review of minutes from October. A motion to approve minutes was made, the motion was seconded, and minutes were approved unanimously.
 - B. Review of minutes from November. A motion to approve minutes was made, the motion was seconded, and minutes were approved unanimously.
- III. Old Business**
 - A. Approval of bylaws: Review completed
 - B. TTT Grant
 1. News: The TTT Trauma Informed Care for Justice Impacted Citizens grant was awarded to Clark County by SAMSHA and approved by BOCC. This grant will allow 10 people from Clark County to become Trained Trainers in TIC4JIC. This is 10 less people than we originally requested. SAMSHA decreased the number of trainers from each community from 20 to 10 in order to accommodate more communities.
 2. A training committee has been organized to help oversee the implementation of this award. The committee is made up of Brooke Wagner, Abby Glaser, and Theresa Arnold.
 3. Organizations with staff attending the training have been contacted via email previously and were reminded to confirm potential training dates in the upcoming weeks.
 - C. Coalition Engagement Agreement
 1. Reviewed organizations that signed CEA. Requested organizations that have not signed to complete and submit the CEA. A CEA reminder will be given at the full committee meeting in Feb.
 - D. Reentry Map
 1. Reviewed reentry map. Did not have opportunity to compare it with data from previous meeting. Marcie Reynolds noted that data from the probation department still needed to be entered. Group discussed additional housing resources to be included within community intercept (Cornerstone and PW).
- IV. New Business**
 - A. Officers
 1. Brooke Wagner nominated as chair, Brooke accepted the nomination. The motion was seconded, and the nomination was approved by vote unanimously.
 2. Gina Kicos was nominated for Vice Chair and will confirm acceptance after reaching out to her employer. If approved, a virtual vote for Gina will

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be shared with the steering committee. Vice chair position is open for now.

B. 2023 Calendar

1. Reviewed the Reentry Coalition calendar for the year. The committee motioned to vote for the calendar, and the motion was seconded. The 2023 calendar was approved by vote, unanimously.

C. Fair Chance Day

1. Committee discussed Fair Chance Day and what had been successful in the past. The committee was most supportive of having the event on Thursday afternoons. We will begin by having the event each month and will reassess the frequency of the event this fall.

D. Homeless Court

1. Gina Kicos discuss the Homeless Court with the steering committee. Homeless courts are special court sessions for homeless defendants that resolve outstanding misdemeanor offences and warrants. We did not have enough time to watch the video. The video will be shared with the committee after the meeting. The committee agreed that we would like to learn more about Homeless Court.
