Meeting Minutes

- a. Meeting was called to order at 9:05 with 26 people in attendance. Those in attendance introduced themselves and their organization.
 - i. Motion to approve October minutes was made and seconded. There was unanimous approval for the Oct minutes.
- b. We had an Employment Panel where different organizations discussed how they can help serve justice-impacted citizens in regard to employment. Summaries of the services provided by these agencies were requested and are attached.
 - i. Panelists:
 1. Brooke Wagner, Clark County Department of Reentry
 - a. We offer assistance in crafting impactful resumes and cover letters tailored to showcase the unique skills and experiences of our clients. Through our Fair Chance Employer Job List, individuals gain access to a curated selection of employers committed to offering opportunities to those with justice involvement. Job searching becomes a targeted and strategic process with the guidance of our career counseling services. Moreover, we facilitate connections to training and education programs, fostering continuous skill development and opening doors to new career pathways. Recognizing the importance of professional attire, our program even extends the opportunity to purchase work items, ensuring that our clients are well-equipped for success in the workforce.  2. Theresa Arnold, Clark County OMJ
 - a. Erin Wiloughby was unable to attend and the presentation about OMJ was provided by Theresa Arnold, who oversees the CCMEP program. OhioMeansJobs serves as Clark County's central hub for employment and resources. OMJ supports clark county residents with building resumes, employment searches, job readiness training, on the job training, and oversees the WIOA program (which can help citizens access training for in-



demand jobs). OMJ also has a youth program, CCMEP, an employment and support program for young adults aged 14-24.

3. Gina Kicos, VA

- a. The VA offers a wide variety of services based on the client's need, including supported employment, community-based employment services, transitional work, vocational assistance, and homeless veteran community employment services. 4. Stacy Faller, OOD

- a. Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD) is the State of Ohio agency whose mission is to empower Ohioans with disabilities through employment, disability determination, and independence. OOD supports citizens with cognitive and physical disabilities as well as with some mental health disorders. OOD helps connect the people of Ohio who have disabilities with the resources, support, and opportunities that fit their unique needs, abilities, and interests so that they can find and retain meaningful employment. OOD also supports Ohioans applying for disability insurance or supplemental income by helping to determine whether they medically qualify for federal disability benefits through the Social Security Administration (SSA). 5. Ashton Dupler, Dayton Equity Center

- a. The Dayton Equity centers mission is to create initiatives and build coalitions that restore communities, addressing issues of food security, youth education, workforce development and employment opportunities to create social mobility in underserved communities. Specifically focusing on folks in reentry and the resettlement community, our three signature adult workforce initiatives include the Power Pathway (Logistics & Heavy Equipment Operation), Cyber Pathway (Cybersecurity & IT), and Grow with Google (Small Business Tools) courses. We serve folks across county lines and with a variety of barriers in employment, with 30-60-90 day follow-up to ensure graduates find living-wage employment. We are hopeful to launch an initiative in Clark County in



the attached materials and let me know if you have any questions. Additional information in attached handouts.





Vocational Goals

Consult Services

Supported Employment

Supported Employment is intended for Veterans living with mental health and/or physical disabilities with significant barriers to employment. It includes ongoing vocational assessments, benefits planning, rapid/individualized job search, job development, and follow-along supports from a Rehabilitation Counselor integrated into the Veteran's treatment team.

Community Based Employment Services

Community Based Employment Services is a program similar to SE but not restricted regarding diagnosis. It provides a range of services leading to competitive employment, and the Veteran receives continuing clinical support. Services include skills training, job development, job placement, supportive counseling, and interventions within the work environment to ensure the continued employment and self-sufficiency of the Veteran.

Transitional Work

Transitional Work provides Veterans with vocational and clinical services in actual work settings needed to gain experience and resilience to prepare for community-based competitive employment. This program is appropriate for Veterans living with physical or mental health diagnoses who have a goal of competitive employment in the community.



Non-Consult Services

Vocational Assistance

Vocational Assistance is a set of assessment, counseling, or other related services that may be offered to groups or individuals. These services are short-term and for a Veteran capable of independent job searches. The goal is to provide the supports and resources needed for the Veteran to successfully obtain, maintain, or transition competitive employment.

Homeless Veteran Community Employment Services

HVCES services are provided to Veterans receiving services from the Veterans Health Administration homeless programs in order to improve housing stability. Services include vocational assessment, access to job leads, job development, and ongoing supports for retention.
