## Meeting Minutes

### I. Call to order at 8:31

- a. Welcomed members and everyone introduced themselves with 25 people in attendance.
- b. Wendy Doolittle motion to approve both July & August minutes, Commissioner Rittenhouse seconded, and coalition voted unanimously to approve.

### II. Old Business

- a. Reviewed 2024 goals
  - i. Reviewed FCW goals:
    1. We've had 67 people in attendance so far. We have 2 events left and the goal is to get 25 people at each event. Committee shared ideas on how to improve the event with possible evening hours, possible change of venue to library, opportunities for transportation support, inviting employers (mentioned Frisch's and HSG Code Blue specifically) and surveying clients.
  - ii. Homeless court initiative:
    1. We will continue working on this in 2025. Committee is working on gathering data. Committee discussed barriers to collecting data about fines and fees from this population.
  - iii. Capacity and we reviewed the 2024 events:
    1. Coalition agreed that we would like to do the reentry simulation again in 2025. To continue reentry simulation, we will need financial support from our organizations.
    2. Project Woman and possibly NAMI are interested in trauma informed care training.
  - iv. Enhanced representation on Relink.org:
    1. We have met this goal. We will continue yearly reminders about relink to the coalition.
  - v. Housing initiatives:
    1. We will have a meeting before the end of the year to determine practicality of resource guide.
- b. 2024 goal survey
  - i. No survey was given, instead we had a group discussion about the goals outlined above.

### III. New Business

- a. Other Coalition Updates:
  - i. We discussed new committees to be created for 2025 goals. Also, we discussed what other coalitions are represented on the committee and requested a representative from those coalitions to update our coalition.

1. Transportation (TCC), Lynn Corsessel from Mental Health Services.
  2. Haitian Coalition, no volunteers. We will reach out to Casey Rawlins.
  3. Partners in Prevention (PIP), Carey McKee.
  4. Criminal Justice Meeting, Scot Donley from APA if he is offered to attend.
  5. Substance abuse coalition, Jacob Clark from Clark County Combined Health District.
- b. Ignite Reading about Coalition Planning
- i. We looked over the Ignite reading and discussed the development of a community action plan.
  - ii. Discussed how we would use the Ignite reading to help with our 2025 goals.
    1. Community Action Plan
      - a. Reviewed steps:
        - i. Reentry coalition has already completed mission /vision /bylaws in 2022, SWOT analysis in 2024, SIS gets updated yearly, Resource Panels in the fall of 2023, Online Resource Local Resource Guide on Reentry Website is updated yearly and Relink.org was 83 percent of RC orgs registered.
        - ii. We decided that we did not need to formally vote for the community action plan, but coalition is in favor of moving forward.
    - iii. Strategy Committee
      1. Discussed the development of a strategy committee. This will include reviewing the 2024 goals survey data, determining 2025 goals, and developing timeline for CAP. This information will be shared at November meeting.
      2. Commitment: Jacob Clark from CCCHD, Mandy Adkins from Emerge, Thomas McGrath from CSEA, Abby Glaser from Encompass, Carey McKee from PIP
      3. Goal for November meeting:
        - a. Share CAP timeline
        - b. Share 2025 Goals
        - c. Determine community partners that serve each goal/action item
