## Meeting Minutes

- I. Meetings was called to order at 8:33 AM with 22 people in attendance.
  - a. Attendees introduced themselves and their agency.
- II. A motion was made to approve the minutes and it was seconded. Approval of September minutes passed unanimously.
  - a. It was noted that September minutes did not include all in attendance at that meeting. An attendance list will be included when the minutes are uploaded online.
- III. Committee Updates were provided.
  - a. Housing Committee: Brooke and Gina shared updates from the housing committee. They noted the challenges regarding homeless court (buy in from courts, public defender office, and data), new initiatives around eviction sealing, and the possibility of exploring warrant sealing.
  - b. Legislative Update: Brooke provided a legislative update and discussed the following bills:
    - i. HB50 – Certificate for Qualified Housing has passed and will be in effect soon. Those leaving prison that complete the Ready to Rent curriculum will received a CQH. Clark County Reentry was trained in Ready to Rent as well and will be piloting this program next year. Those that complete the training will have the opportunity to submit an application to the court for a CQH.
    - ii. HB33: Mandates all recovery housing needs certification. A list of registered recovery houses is available online on the ODRC website.
    - iii. SB37: Will change wait period and look back regarding suspended drivers license and SR22.
    - iv. SB198: New bill to support access to identification documents for inmates before release from prison, including state ID, birth certificate, SS card, and resume.
    - v. HB289: This bill will update rules for unhoused sex offenders requiring they report to the SORN officer monthly or will receive a charge of equal statue to the original charge.
      1. The RC discussed the additional challenges this will incur in the community and decided to write a letter to the legislation about how this bill.
  - c. Haitian Coalition:
    - i. Casey reported about an upcoming food box pick-up and asked folks to register their clients in advance.
    - ii. HC is considering ISLA translate live to help with communication barriers and will share information with the committee as they review this service.
    - iii. St Vincents is working with Nehimiah to develop a list of unhoused folks using grocery land food cards as a incentive.
    - iv. St. Vincents is hosting a legal clinic 3 times per month for Haitian community members that register in advance.
  - d. PIP: Wendy noted an upcoming PIP event -Talk Cop, on the evening of 11/20. The flyer was shared with coalition members on 11/18.

- e. Parole: Scot noted that unhoused sex offenders are required to wear ankle monitors now for the first 6 months post release.
- f. Probation: No representative to share.
- g. CAP: Brooke shared about the strategy meeting.

IV. New Business -A survey was shared with the committee asking them to sign up for committees for the 2025 year.

- a. The CAP Timeline was shared with the committee. It was noted that this is a draft and may change based on the needs of the committee. The final goal is to complete a 3 or 5 year plan (depending on the outcome the research). See timeline attached.
- b. We reviewed the 2025 Goals & Committees
  - i. Members were asked to complete the survey and sign up a committee that best matches their interests and organizations. Surveys were collected at the end of the meeting. Brooke will send out the survey to those not in attendance.
  - ii. Each committee will be tasked with meeting before our next meeting (January) to develop action plans for 2025. Brooke will share information with each committee to help them organize their first meetings and set their goals.
- c. 2025 FCW Dates were discussed. Coalition agreed to the following dates:
  - i. March 26, May 28, July 30, Sept 24, Nov 19 (earlier in month due to TG holiday).
- d. We reviewed the 2025 Reentry Coalition Meeting Schedule, noted that we updated full committee meetings to triannual instead of quarterly.

V. Old Business

- a. Upcoming Reentry Events
  - i. CC Reentry shared information about Fair Chance Wednesday on 11/20/24. A list of vendors attending was shared. We also discussed the work to engage employers for this event. Tech 2 was mentioned as a possible employer to reach out to in the future.
  - ii. Citizen Circle -Brooke will reach to coalition members to request volunteers for February and March event. We also discussed the CC holiday party on Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> and asked folks to share any giveaways they may have available and invited coalition members to attend (but to register in advance to help us ensure we have enough food).
