## Meeting Minutes

- I. The meeting was called to order at 8:31 with 27 people in attendance.
- II. Coalition reviewed the minutes from May. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Ernest Stockton and seconded by Abby Glaser. The motion passed unanimously.
- III. Updates:
  - a. Haitian Coalition: Casey shared that efforts are underway to expedite passports and birth certificates. For clients with foreign-born children under age 6, contact St. Vincent de Paul.
  - b. Reentry Committees:
    - i. CAP:
      1. The CAP Committee is moving forward with data analysis for the final report.
      2. The Community Partner Survey was distributed at the May meeting, and 20 responses have been received so far. Please complete it if you haven't already. The link to this survey is: <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/ccrcsurvey2025>
    - ii. Education:
      1. Greene County: Gun Safety & Legal Education Training – Flyer was shared in a previous email. Gina noted the target audience is mental health providers.
        - a. The training will be held on October 9th from 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM at the Midwest Shooting Center in Beavercreek. Light breakfast and boxed lunch will be provided. CEUs available through MHRB.
      2. Trauma-Informed Care (TIC) Training: Open to coalition members, community partners, and surrounding county agencies. Scheduled for this fall, date TBD.
    - iii. Access to Service:

    - iv. Housing:
      1. Eviction Documentary & Panel: Planning to host a screening and discussion with Kathy Rowell and community leaders in partnership with the Education Committee. Aiming to coordinate a week in November. This event will raise awareness around eviction issues. Date TBD.
  - c. Legislative update:
    - i. Hope Manning provided an overview of recent legislative developments. See attached.
- IV. New Business
  - a. Transportation Update
    - i. City and county transportation managers are scheduled to attend next month's meeting to provide an update.
    - ii. Micro Transit: A two-week rollout began July 15th, with free rides available through July 28th. After that, rides will be \$2, with a discounted rate of \$1 for qualifying individuals. Service runs from 6:40 AM to 6:40 PM. Rides can be scheduled via phone, internet, or the "Field Trips"



app by Via (Springfield Micro Transit). SCAT will continue operating through the end of July. Hours may be adjusted in the future.

b. New Leaf House

- i. A 5-bedroom home is available with individual rooms for rent as transitional housing. Eligibility requirements include being a single male, age 18 or older, and justice-impacted or recently released. Individuals with a history of substance use disorder or mental health concerns must have completed a treatment program. Rent payment is required, though some assistance may be available for those recently released. A referral or letter of support from a case manager is also required. Tenants must be able to abide by lease terms and demonstrate motivation to pursue independence. The goal of this housing is to support individuals in building self-sufficiency and establishing a positive relationship with the landlord.
