

2025-2039 Plan

The District prepares a 15-year Solid Waste Management Plan that sets goals and programs for the district. The plan is updated every five years and the update is ratified by political entities representing at least 60 percent of the county's population and by the county commissioners, as well as being approved by Ohio EPA.
